100% of Biden voters who voted for him because they did not like Trump believe that Trump was responsible for the rioters overtaking The Capitol on January 6.

99% of Biden primary supporters believe that President Joe Biden won the election legitimately.

98% of Core Democrats believe that President Joe Biden won the election legitimately.

97% of Sanders/Warren Democrats are vaccinated.

96% of Biden voters reported always wearing a mask in April compared with 57% of Trump voters.

95% of college students are concerned about attacks based upon race or ethnicity.

94% of Los Angeles County voters agree that homelessness is a very serious problem in Los Angeles.

93% of Democrats and 71% of independents think that Joe Biden won the presidency legitimately.

92% of Biden voters are vaccinated.

91% of voters favor doing more to ensure that parents can find affordable, high-quality child care for their children up to age five.

90% of Twitter users are also on Facebook.

89% of Democrats and 56% of independents believe that the events of January 6 are an attempt to overturn the results of the presidential election.

88% of Americans say that 2020 was below average or one of the worst years (the worst year ever going back to 1991).

87% of Democrats believe that the healthcare system today works more for the insurance and drug industries than the average person.

86% of Democrats and 54% of independents are concerned about the events of January 6 and what it means for our country.

85% of Americans support the federal government funding the manufacturing and distribution of rapid antigen tests as a way to reopen the economy.

84% of women believe that child care and preschool programs are a good investment of taxpayers' money.

83% of African American college students are worried about being a victim of a racial attack.

82% of Democrats believe that government should do more to solve problems and help meet people's needs.

81% of Democrats and 55% of independents believe that the events of January 6 are an act of terrorism.

80% of seniors believe that their approach to issues is in the mainstream of most Americans' thinking (but just 58% of 18- to 34-year-olds feel this way).

79% of voters say it is important to include long-term care in Build Back Better.

78% of parents say their children are spending at least 91 minutes MORE on their screens in addition to virtual learning due to the pandemic.

77% of parents say that protecting their children is an important reason to get vaccinated against COVID-19 themselves.

76% of both Democrats and Republicans believe that their approach to issues is in the mainstream of most Americans' thinking.

75% of liberals believe that SCOTUS is too conservative.

74% of Americans are confident that their state can administer a fair election (85% for Democrats, 59% for Republicans).

73% support passing the Build Back Better Act.

72% of voters in Tennessee are concerned that 37% of Tennesseans have debt in collections.

71% believe that their approach to issues is in the mainstream of most Americans' thinking.

70% of Asian American/Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders say discrimination against AANHPI adults has become more common since the pandemic.

69% of Republicans believe that America's best years are behind us.

68% of white Americans have positive feelings toward police and law enforcement agencies compared with 37% among Hispanic Americans and 31% among African Americans.

67% of voters under the age of 30 express BIG concern that 24 states are likely to ban abortion completely if *Roe v. Wade* is overturned.

66% of 18- to 34-year-olds say that the federal government is not doing enough to address climate change (52% overall).

65% of 50- to 64-year-olds think it is likely that they or a family member will need long-term care.

64% of voters believe it is very important for President Biden and Congress to take action to make sure everyone has access to comprehensive healthcare.

63% of 18- to 49-year-old women believe that abortion should be legal always or most of the time.

62% of college students expect their student loan debt to remain with them for at least six years after they graduate.

61% of strong Democrats believe that America's best years are ahead of us.

60% of independents say that government should do more to solve problems and help people's needs.

59% of public-school parents favor requiring children to be vaccinated in order to return to school in person.

58% of Americans say that they are more concerned about making sure that all who want to vote can do so (38% are more concerned about ineligible people voting).

57% of Biden voters believe America's best years are ahead of us.

56% of independents say that federal funding for child care and preschool should be increased.

55% of college students worry very or somewhat often about having too much student loan debt.

54% of Americans believe that abortion should be legal always or most of the time.

53% of Republican college students say that students are intolerant and unwilling to listen to someone who supports a political figure they strongly disagree with (45% overall).

52% of 18- to 34-year-olds have a TikTok account.

51% of parents of 12- to 17-year-olds say their children who are eligible have been vaccinated.

50% of Republicans identify more as supporters of the Republican Party than they do with Donald Trump (a consistent trend since January).

49% of Americans believe that the riot on January 6 at The Capitol will lead to a major increase in violence (59% among Democrats, 36% among Republicans).

48% of Asian American/Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders say they have been unable to visit family outside the United States due to travel restrictions during the pandemic.

47% of Republicans say immigration is the most important issue for them (their top issue), while just 7% of Democrats feel similarly.

46% of college students say that race relations is one of the most important issues for them personally (tied for the second most important issue for them below COVID-19).

45% of parents in urban areas reported in April that over the year their children had experienced only virtual learning (compared with 25% in suburban areas).

44% of Americans are hopeful and optimistic about the future of the country (the lowest level recorded since 1998).

43% of Democrats say that COVID-19 is the most important issue for them (their top issue), while just 12% of Republicans feel similarly.

42% of Americans believe that the Supreme Court is too conservative.

41% of dads of 12- to 17-year-olds say their children who are eligible have been vaccinated.

40% of Americans have positive feelings toward Dr. Anthony Fauci, 36% are negative (70% of Democrats are positive, 68% of Republicans are negative).

39% of Republicans in Biden states are confident that their state can administer a fair election (76% of Republicans in states that Trump won are confident in this).

38% of Twitter users disapprove of the job that Joe Biden is doing as president compared with 54% overall. #twitter≠reality

37% of GOP women identify more with Donald Trump than they do the Party--a year ago 58% of GOP women identified more with Trump.

36% of Los Angeles County voters have themselves or know someone who has experienced homelessness or housing insecurity in the past year.

35% of Twitter users have positive feelings toward Twitter.

34% of Democrats have positive feelings toward Liz Cheney compared with 8% of Republicans who feel similarly.

33% of college students have lost a close friend or family member due to COVID-19.

32% of Hispanic voters believe that Republicans in Congress are in the mainstream on issues compared with 59% who feel this way about Democrats in Congress.

31% of suburban women have positive feelings toward Donald Trump, 61% are negative (Joe Biden is 43% positive, 42% negative).

30% of voters believe it is VERY difficult to find well-qualified home healthcare providers.

29% of parents say their children have fallen behind both academically and socially/emotionally during the pandemic.

28% of 18- to 34-year-olds have positive feelings toward Major League Baseball compared with 41% among seniors.

27% of Americans over the course of the year believe the country is headed in the right direction, the lowest level since 2016.

26% of Twitter users are Republicans compared with 39% overall. #twitter≠reality

25% of those who are not vaccinated believe that President Joe Biden won the election legitimately (76% of those who are vaccinated believe this is the case).

24% of rural Americans have positive feelings toward Joe Biden, 66% are negative.

23% of Americans consider themselves to be out of the mainstream on issues (they are much more likely to be young, independent, and live in the West).

22% of Biden supporters in the Democratic Primary are TikTok users (50% of Sanders/Warren supporters are TikTok users).

21% of Americans say that a child under 18 should never have a social media account.

20% of Sanders/Warren Democrats have positive feelings towards police and law enforcement agencies compared with 47% among Biden Democrats.

19% of Republicans use TikTok compared with 33% of Democrats.

18% of college students have tested positive for COVID-19 (in April).

17% of African Americans believe that Republicans in Congress are in the mainstream on issues.

16% of Americans have positive feelings toward Facebook.

15% of Americans say they will not take the COVID vaccine.

14% of parents said that their children's schools were too slow in reopening and 14% said they were too fast (70% said schools struck the right balance).

13% of non-college Republicans are on Twitter compared with 32% among college educated Republicans.

12% of Americans report that they are falling backward financially, including 26% of working-class whites.

11% of Republicans say that Donald Trump was responsible for the January 6 riot at The Capitol (48% say antifa was responsible).

10% of non-vaccinated Republicans say their employer requiring them to get vaccinated would make them more likely to get vaccinated.

9% of women who are 50 and older are TikTok users, while 53% of 18- to 49-year-old women are on TikTok.

8% of college students believe that democracy in the United States today is working very well.

7% of Republicans say the country was heading in the right direction in January.

6% of non-vaccinated Americans favor a vaccine mandate (67% of vaccinated Americans favor a mandate).

5% of vaccinated parents will not vaccinate their children.

4% say their child's screen time not related to school has decreased during the pandemic, 54% say it has INCREASED.
